Gail Harker, LCGI, is a Canadian who resided for nearly 20 years in Britain, until returning to America in 1995. She moved to Britain in 1976 with her American husband and family. She studied art in Canada, Scotland, and England. She completed both Parts 1 and 2(Diploma) of the

City and Guilds Design and Embroidery course, with *Distinction* in both parts. She qualified for the Senior Award of *Licentiate*ship (LCGI) given by the City and Guilds of London Institute. Gail is a teacher of several Certificate and Diploma embroidery courses. Gail founded and operates the *Gail Harker Creative Studies Center* in Oak Harbor, Washington. She pioneered the establishment of the first City & Guilds Creative Studies Centers in North America. She authored five books: *Embroidery Skills: Machine Embroidery* (published internationally in five languages), Merehurst, *Fairy Tale Quilts and Embroidery*, Merehurst, *Christmas Stitches*, Cassell, *Creative Machine Embroidery*, Batsford and *Tassel Making*, self published. She is a contributing author for: *Starting to Stitch Creatively* (Batsford), wherein she authored the section on Materials, and contributed to the Machine Embroidery chapters for the *Merehurst Book of Needlework*.

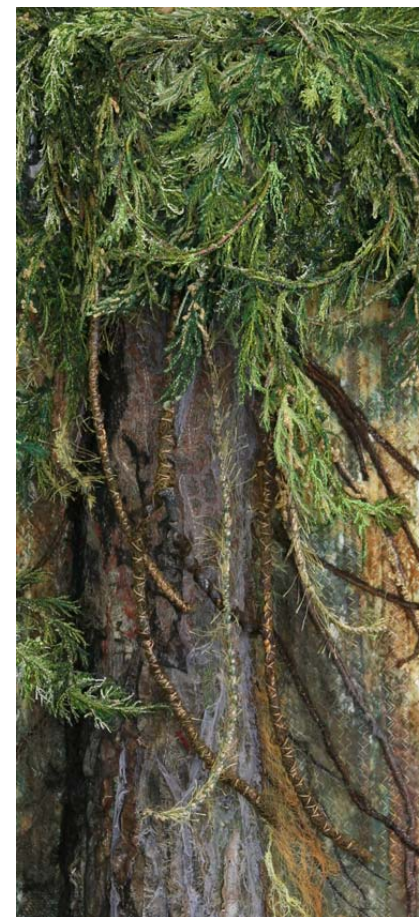

The Rhythms of Nature

The special nature of organic design will be explored through the natural world around us. The demonstrations, instruction and workshop will focus on a few samples chosen from plants, flowers, trees, foliage, bark, leaves, roots, berries or mosses. I will have inspirational pictures available at the studio or you may bring a few of your own if you wish.

Students will use simple concepts to show the expressive use of color, line, texture and shape to create contemporary and innovative machine stitched samples. These samples will create a portfolio of special effects to personalize the essence of the theme.

Student Level

All that is required is an enthusiasm to learn new machine techniques. Students do not require an art or design background. It is preferable that potential students have done a little free machine stitching and are familiar with their sewing machines before starting the class.

The Color of Nature

Students will select a key color to paint a few papers and fabrics in the classroom. A simple color study will be developed.

Special Effects

A variety of fabrics, interfacings, machine made cords, wires, machine and hand embroidery threads will be used in the samples.

Other methods include:

Layered and fused fabrics
Laces and other see-through techniques
Edges to include tassels, fringes and fraying.
Dimensional and Cutback Appliqué
Automatic and Free Machine Embroidery techniques will be used.

At the Course Conclusion

Students will have created a portfolio or binder of samples inspired from a theme. The samples along with class notes will illustrate techniques and effects. They will provide a source of inspiration from which to work for years to come.
