

COLOR PLAY WITH FABRICS AND STITCH



Come join us to make exciting small Fabric Pictures.

We will be cutting out motifs and designs - - both realistic and abstract, to apply to exciting colored background fabric. An array of different colored hand painted fabrics and threads are available for students to work with. Color will be the inspirational starting point for the small compositions. Learn how to work with a few stitches that bring personality to the pieces. No design experience is necessary. Participants will learn how to build the design elements into their composition and just have fun. Through this exercise you will also learn about Systematic Color Schemes and values.

This course is for anyone who thinks they might have a creative whisper in their body and would like to learn how to begin creating pictures. All you need is enthusiasm, and a desire to work with fabric, threads and design ideas. Every perceived mistake may be a new opportunity.

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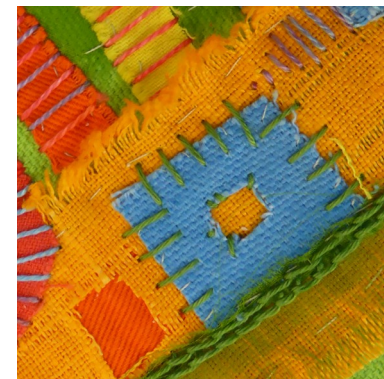
