She qualified for the Senior Award of Licentiateship (LCGI) awarded by the City and Guilds of London Institute. Gail is a tutor of several Certificate and Diploma art and embroidery courses. Gail founded and operates the Gail Harker Creative Studies Center in La Conner, Washington. She pioneered the establishment of the first City & Guilds Creative Studies centers in North America

Introduction to the Minor Project

Design Study from British Embroidery

This introduction will allow students to develop an **overview to British Embroidery**, particularly the type of motifs, designs and compositions that were employed at each century. If you are not a stitch student, speak to Gail about another Historic Theme.
